

·Want this number to decrease over time




Returns to Homelessness

- Want this number to decrease over time
 - Last year 10%
 - This year 6%



Number of People Experiencing Homelessness

On one night = Point-in-Time Count, 152 people total



- •Over time = de-duplicated number of 12 months of database entries
 - 266 unduplicated count in one year
 - •210 homeless for the first time



Exits to/Retention of Permanent Housing

	FY2016	FY2017
People in Shelter, TH & RRH who exited	234	240
Of those, exited to permanent housing	67	84
% successful exits	29%	35%
People in PSH	103	108
Of those, remained in PSH or exited to permanent housing	101	104
% successful exits/retention	98%	96%



Family Unification Program (FUP) MOU



HUD announced two funding opportunities this Spring

1. Mainstream Voucher Program

- Non-elderly persons with disabilities
- Orange County Dept. of Housing & Community Development (OCHCD) not applying

Family Unification Program (FUP)

- Families lacking adequate housing, CPS involved, eligible for a Housing Choice Voucher (HCV)
- Youth 18-24, foster care involved, homeless or at risk
- Required coordination and MOU between
 - PHA (Orange County Dept. of Housing & Community Development)
 - PCWA (Orange County Dept. of Social Services)
 - CoC (Orange County Partnership to End Homelessness))

MOU Requirements

- •PHA and PCWA's commitment to program administration
- CoC's commitment to cooperate and assist
- PHA and PCWA's goals and standards of success
- Reps from PHA, PCWA, CoC
- Motion: approve Partnership to execute MOU with County partners for FUP application



HMIS@NCCEH Governance Charter ratification
